

Baptism Promises Renewed By Paul Turner

Whenever Catholics celebrate baptism at Mass, all the faithful renew their baptismal promises. At the Easter Vigil, those about to be baptized must respond to questions asking them to renounce evil and to profess their faith. Having witnessed this, the rest of the community responds to the



same questions, renewing their baptismal promises.

Whenever infants are baptized, their parents and godparents renew their promises because an infant is incapable of making them. In this renewal, the parents and godparents demonstrate their willingness to share their faith with this growing child. When the baptism takes place at Sunday Mass, all the faithful respond to the questions with the parents and godparents. This renewal replaces the creed, but it also gives all members of the community a chance to pledge that they will share their faith with this child as well.

On Easter Sunday in the United States, the entire assembly renews its baptismal promises, and this replaces the creed on that day. The design of the Easter liturgy is that the renewal takes place at the Vigil right after baptism. However, not everyone attends the Vigil, and it was thought important for all to make a renewal of promises at least once a year. Every Catholic should make an effort to attend the Vigil, when they will celebrate the resurrection of Christ and witness the baptisms. They will also be invited to renew their promises in the presence of those who have renounced sin and professed their faith in order to join the Body of Christ.

During Lent, Catholics accept penance to turn away from sin and follow the gospel. When they renew their baptismal promises at Easter, they bring their Lent to a fitting climax.





GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

"Where do they get their energy!" Maybe you've said that about your children as they run around the yard while you're trying to wrangle them inside for bedtime. Jokes abound about how sugar and caffeine are what keep most adults going, but we know it's proper nutrition, exercise, and rest that enable us to do well whatever it is we do. That is all relevant to us physically. What about spiritually? Bishop Barron, writing on the Gospel, says, "Jesus declares that he is the vine and we are the branches. He is the power and energy source in which we live." (Word on Fire Bible, 548) Just as we see the effects of sugar and caffeine on people, we see the supernatural effects of Jesus' love on, and in, people. As he nurtures us with his perfect love, and that flows into us who are grafted onto him, it changes us. It transforms us and converts us away from sin and toward God. We fill up on that spiritual fuel in the sacramental life of the Church and become a witness to it in how we go about our days - loving one another.




PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

"Children, let us love not in word or speech but in deed and truth." These words from John in our second reading provide the perfect bridge between the ministry of Paul, about whom we heard in the first reading, and Christ's message in the Gospel. With Jesus as "the power and energy source in which we live," we not only can profess the truth, but live it. We not only give our own account of Christ working in us, as Paul did, who came to them speaking out "boldly in the name of the Lord," but we stand beside one another, as Barnabas did, vouching for Paul to the Apostles. We are united in baptism, in love, in profession of faith, and in communion with one another. When we consistently act in a Christian manner toward others and keep God's commandments, John says, we "remain in him, and he in [us], and the way we know that he remains in us is from the Spirit he gave us." In other words, those who remain in Christ "will bear much fruit" - a tangible sign that easily answers the question, "where does he/she get her energy?"

PRAY Is there anything in your life that is an obstacle to Jesus being the power and energy source in which you live? Are your days fueled more by anger, frustration, or ambition than his love? Pray this week in thanksgiving to God for where he has given you conversion of heart, and ask him for the grace to see where improvement is needed and the will to make it happen.

Fifth Sunday of Easter

Have you noticed broken tree branches lying on street curbs, yards, or in the park? It is common to see branches that have broken off and fallen to the ground due to strong winds and storms, especially during wintertime or shortly after. Severed from their trees, the fallen branches will wither and die. They can't live detached from tree trunks or grow leaves, pines, or roots.

That is a metaphor for us urban dwellers. Vine and branches is a similar metaphor that Jesus uses in today's Gospel to exemplify the significance of our unity with Him. He is the vine that is connected to God and us, the branches. The vine provides the branches with the life-giving sustenance they need to live and be fruitful. In today's short reading, Jesus uses the word remain or abide in some other Bible translations seven times, promising to abide in us and calling us to abide in Him. Think of a concerned father or mother appealing to their child to hold their hand to keep them from straying and getting lost.

It is important to point out that what Jesus said is not merely a fleeting suggestion. It is not like someone trying a diet to eat healthier, only to move to another if it doesn't work or in pursuit of better results. Jesus's words are not one way or a better way, it is the only way for us to get all we need to live, grow, and flourish from Him.

We know we have little control over much that happens in our lives, yet we try to control every aspect and influence every outcome. We can be overwhelmed with feelings of angst, anger, and fear. We agonize, fret, and carry heavy burdens only to recall that God abides in us when it gets too much to bear. Jesus said that He remains in us like a vine to branches; it is up to us to remain in Him, always.

Jesus continues to speak to us in today's Gospel and New Testament readings, "Without me you can do nothing." (John 15:5b). "And his commandment is this: we should believe in the name of his Son, Jesus Christ, and love one another just as he commanded us. Those who keep his commandments remain in him, and he in them, and the way we know that he remains in us is from the Spirit that he gave us." (1 John 3:23-24).

Let us put Jesus' call into practice starting today and have it become a life-long habit. Think about how your time is spent and what contributes to negative feelings and anxiety. Which negative thoughts, bad habits, regrets, and fears can you prune away for healthier living? Spend time with God daily to reflect on His words by reading the Bible or spiritual writings. Be in His presence, silently and attentively, to hear and discern His voice. Recognize and give thanks for His gifts, love, and desire to abide in you.


